Dear Administrator Green:

On behalf of the Modernizing Foreign Assistance Network (MFAN), a bipartisan reform coalition comprised of international development and foreign policy practitioners and experts, we thank you for your commitment to advancing effective U.S. foreign assistance. We write, however, with grave concern regarding the August 3<sup>rd</sup> apportionment action by the Office of Management and Budget and urge your utmost attention and commitment to preserving stable and effective funding for U.S. foreign aid.

MFAN advocates for more effective and accountable U.S. foreign assistance that will deliver greater results for people in need and U.S. taxpayers, including evidence-based decision making and evaluation of the effectiveness of assistance programs. Any review or changes to U.S. foreign assistance programs should rely on robust program evaluations to assess effectiveness<sup>i</sup>, follow legal channels through the congressional appropriations process, and minimize disruptions to critical American efforts abroad<sup>ii</sup>. These are fundamental criteria for efficiently spending American taxpayer money and effectively advancing American interests and values abroad.


An unprecedented, unilateral move by the Trump administration to cancel already appropriated funds without Congressional review would work against<sup>iii</sup> shared development objectives and yield sub-optimal outcomes for U.S. interests long-term. Funding decisions that are not evidence-based exacerbate funding instability and interruptions, which limit the effectiveness<sup>iv</sup> of programs designed to save lives and further American interests. An uncertain and chaotic funding process, including highly disruptive and unplanned cuts such as rescissions, can have detrimental effects<sup>v</sup> on critical programs. U.S. assistance programs are most effective when they are carefully planned, budgeted for, and funded.

Further, as with last year's attempt to rescind lawfully appropriated funds for foreign assistance, we remain concerned that OMB is seeking to circumvent Congress' power of the purse. The proposed review covers a broad set of foreign assistance accounts, suggesting that OMB is attempting widespread cuts without detailed review of the success or failure of potential spending.

We urge you to act swiftly and decisively on this matter in order to preserve the integrity and effectiveness of our foreign aid programs. As you are aware, foreign assistance plays an important role in achieving America's national security objectives abroad; at a time of increased great power competition, this sends the wrong message to our global partners. MFAN stands alongside the foreign affairs community, including our partners at InterAction and the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition, in opposing any potential rescission.

We look forward to working with you to advance U.S. values and economic and national security interests by supporting a more just, prosperous, and secure world through effective foreign assistance.
